MED-DESIRE TRAINING OF TRAINERS OF SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC SYSTEM INSTALLERS IN LEBANON

The Lebanese Center for Energy Conservation (LCEC), and within the MED-DESIRE project, is organizing a training of trainers of solar photovoltaic system installers in collaboration with the Italian National Agency for New Technologies, Energy and Sustainable Economic Development. The training is taking place at the Industrial Research Institute (IRI), Lebanese University Campus, Hadath from Monday August 24 till Friday August 28, 2015.

The training is aimed at the formation of knowledge, abilities and skills relevant to the implementation, verification, management and maintenance of photovoltaic systems and subsequent verification of knowledge, skills and competencies relevant to the activity of the installer of photovoltaic systems. It is targeting teachers from the official vocational technical schools in Lebanon and aims at being the first step towards the integration of photovoltaic system installations within the official Lebanese curriculum.

Co-funded by the European Union through the ENPI CBC MED Programme 2007-2013, MED-DESIRE (MEDiterranean DEvelopment of Support Initiatives for solar schemes and Renewable Energies) aims at spreading energy efficiency, and in particular, solar energy across the Mediterranean area. It is composed by nine partners from five countries: Egypt, Italy, Spain, Tunisia and Lebanon.
